

## *Impact of Sports Premium funding 2017-18*

*Moorlands Primary School have used a large percentage of the Sports Premium funding to support teaching and learning within the curriculum. By employing expert teachers and coaches we have been able to upskill staff and enhance the teaching and learning of P.E. across it's whole curriculum. Teachers were asked to reflect on their practice through a skills audit and support was given accordingly. The impact of this has been very positive. In all year groups, the children working at the expected standard or greater depth has exceeded our target of 82%.*

*Reception data shows 76% of children working at typical development, 14% above typical and 10% working below typical development.*

*The impact of the funding has had a far-reaching impact beyond the classroom. There has been an increase in participation in inter-school competitions and festivals. The school has again been awarded the 'School Games Gold Award' for 2017-18. This year we have reached a wider demographic of children, putting on more events for KS1 children and children with special educational needs. In addition to all this the school uses some of the funding to increase participation of sport and activity through an extensive lunchtime and after-school program.*
