Sports Premium Statement & Expenditure 2018/2019

At Moorlands we are committed to improving the health and lifestyle of all our children. We aim to give every child the opportunity to engage in sporting physical activities and competitions through our extensive curriculum teaching, lunch time and after-school program. We have a dedicated staff who value the importance of P.E. and sport and are continually looking to improve upon their own skills and knowledge of physical education.

The Government has given every Primary School funding to develop Physical Education and competitive sport. For the academic year 2018/19 there has been no increase to the Government funding given. This academic year Moorlands Primary received £21,390. We have used this money in many areas of PE and below is the break down how we have spent it. The long-term aim at Moorlands Primary is to have highly skilled teachers; improving the teaching and learning in quality P.E. lessons, improved learning for all children and an increased participation by the children in sporting activities across the Key Stages.
