Football players will be playing each other in a computer game tournament! Footballers from 20 top European teams, including Liverpool and Manchester City, will play against each other.

The 'FIFA 20 Stay and Play Cup' will last from 15th to 19th April and will be **live-streamed** on Twitch. EA Sports, the company which makes the FIFA games, will also give around £800 000 to help people affected by coronavirus.

It's not just football which is getting into e-sports! On 5th April, racing fans watched a **virtual** version of the Vietnam **Grand Prix**. The drivers included some **professional** drivers and a few famous faces.

They played on computers instead of using real cars. Unlike having different types of
