On Tuesday 8th May, 1945, millions of people rejoiced in the news that Germany had surrendered. In towns and cities across the world, people marked the victory with street parties, dancing and singing. Winston Churchill, the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom at that time, gave a rousing speech to the nation.

Your challenge is to use the morse code chart to decipher part of Churchill's famous speech!

TIP: look carefully for the spaces that indicate the end of one letter and the start of another.
