### Speeding – New Hey Road and Thornhill Avenue

To deal with motorists exceeding speed limits by engagement and enforcement where necessary

*A number of speeding operations are planned and ongoing.*

### Vehicle Crime – Oakes and Salendine Nook.

To target those involved in vehicle and other crime in the area with a view to reducing reported incidents.

*Ongoing proactive Police patrols resulting in a number of arrests and convictions. This has seen some real reductions in offences*

### Anti-Social Behaviour (Off Road Bikes) – Salendine Nook.

To deal with off road bikers causing nuisance to residents

*Ongoing work with the use of police off-road bikes has seen a reduction in reports but work is still required and ongoing.*



### Burglary and Vehicle Crime

In recent weeks there have been some fantastic arrests of persons involved in crime across the Huddersfield area. These arrests have been due to some excellent reports and information from the community resulting in officers deploying into the right area at the right time.

Officers continue to be tasked on a daily basis with patrol areas and persons to be aware of, and it is great to see the public are playing their part in crime prevention and bringing offenders to justice by being vigilant and reporting suspicious incidents and people.

We will continue to target offenders and ensure we leave no stone unturned when investigating offences.

Twelve months ago we had some increases in offending around the area including clusters of offending between Hill Grove and Deer Croft.

This shows that offenders do target areas, and we need all communities to be vigilant over the summer months ensuring that their property is secure, including sheds, garages and also vehicles.

Please don't leave valuables on view and be vigilant.

As can be seen, criminals get caught because of the community and Police working together.

We as a partnership can and will make your community a no go area for criminals.

The 10 principles of crime prevention can assist you in reducing the opportunity for crime to occur at your home, your place of work or your business. They can act as a checklist to see what simple and often inexpensive steps that you may be able to take to reduce the opportunity for crime to take place.

The best way to employ the principles is to look at your property as if you were the offender. Identify those weak spots, vulnerable areas and concealments points and prioritise the areas for improvement.

You can contact your Crime Reduction Officers should you require any further advice who will offer a free and independent consultation working with you to ensure that you are taking the best possible approach for your particular circumstances.

### CRIME PREVENTION

- 1, Target Hardening making your property harder for an offender to access.
- 2, Target Removal. Ensuring that a potential target is out of view.
- 3, Reducing the means. Removing items that may help commit an offence.
- 4, Reducing the payoff. Marking property making it harder to sell on.
- 5, Access Control. Locking doors and windows and addressing boundary treatment.
- 6, Surveillance. Consider CCTV

- Establish a Neighbourhood Watch, remove high hedges.
- 7, Environmental Change. Ensure your property looks cared for and well maintained.
- 8, Rule Setting. Last person to leave locks up!
- 9, Increase Chances of Being Caught! Dusk to dawn security lighting, CCTV, alarm and making entry to property time consuming for offenders.
- 10, Deflecting Offenders. Make sure your home always looks occupied especially during the hours of darkness!
