Break and lunch time

In Year 6, morning break will be at 10:40am and lunch will be at 12:30pm. You will exit using the bottom door and play in the bottom playground/MUGA.

You can sensibly use the outdoor gym equipment once we have shown you and it is safe to use. You must not use this equipment before or after school. You will play in a designated area on the bottom playground with your classmates. Some equipment will be available for you to play with.



Moving around school

You are now in Year 6, which means you are setting the example for the whole school.

- When you are changed line-up outside the rooms in line-order quietly and sensibly.



At the end of each week if you have stayed green (no pegs) you will now get a frog sticker so that your parents know you have behaved well.

There will also be whole-class rewards. You will find out more about these during our first week back!



Merits and merit cards will continue. I will award merits for growth-mindset and good attitudes to learning.

British Value Tree - This is outside of Mrs Denney's office. When we will nominate pupils for a British Value, they will write their name on a leaf and stick it onto the branch they received their award for.

Role Model - This will be completed once a month. Each member of the class will complete a nomination. The child with the most votes will win.



<u>Behaviour system</u>

Stage 1 is a verbal warning from your teacher. They will tell you not to do something. Stage 2 - If you continue to misbehave then you will get a peg.

Stage 3 - If you get 2 pegs you miss playtime.

*We will remind you about yellow and red cards the first week back.



How can you ensure that you are ready for Year 6?

<u>Maths</u>

- Times tables: Ensure you know all of your times tables up to 12 x 12. The quicker you can recall these facts (including the inverse), the better!
- 4 rules of number (practise column addition, subtraction, short/long multiplication and short division).
- Time: Make sure that you can tell the time by looking at a watch. It will really help if you are confident with both 12 and 24 hour clock.



English


- Spellings: Practise your year 5/6 spellings.
- Reading: Enjoy reading some books.
- Writing: When writing, ensure that you are using the basics (capital letters, full stops and joined handwriting).



First, you will need to print out the personality template. The template is located where you found this PowerPoint. (Your teacher will slice the grey border off for our class display so please keep your work in the white area.)




In every other section, write the following words:

 5 words about you (adjectives to describe your personality, hobbies/interests, etc.)


*You can write these in any font/style you would like. Try to 'stretch' the word out so it fill most of the section. However, please be consistent with your use of lowercase or uppercase letters.
