Parent Questionnaires

Thank you to everyone who completed a Parent Questionnaire. Your feedback is much appreciated.

There were a few comments and questions, so we hope we can clarify a few areas.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 have reading mornings, where parents are invited to come, if possible, into school to read with children. We understand not all parents are able to attend due to work and other commitments. All children during this time read with adults, so nobody misses out.

We stopped using Seesaw due to the expense. All information is sent out through this newsletter, Twitter, emails and the year group curriculum newsletter. We have discussed changing the newsletter to bi-weekly, however we feel it is good to have weekly communication with families so we can celebrate all the wonderful things children have been doing and pass on messages and information.

Our homework is centred around spelling, timetables and reading, including phonics. The decision to focus homework on these three areas was taken after parent feedback, as well as undertaking research about the impact of homework for primary aged children. We know families have very busy lives and try to keep homework expectations realistic. A curriculum newsletter is sent home termly. If families would like to do further homework linked to curriculum topics, we would love to see it and share it in class.

We offer a wide variety of after school clubs. These vary from term to term, depending on the coaches and staff available to run the clubs. We try to choose clubs that will be popular enough to attract enough children to make it viable to run. In the Autumn term, we offered 17 clubs weekly and in the Spring term there will be 16 clubs.

Unfortunately, we have had to cancel clubs when we have had low uptake. If children would like to suggest other clubs they would like to do, we are more than happy to try to find a coach/adult to run the club.

Children are given opportunities to take part in a variety of sporting events throughout the year. Some events are competitive and others are 'try it' sessions. Different events are held for different year groups. Children are asked in

class if they would like to take part in events. In addition to clubs and sports events, we currently have sports coaches teaching PE sessions four days a week.

We are very pleased with the way our new behaviour policy is going. The children are showing they are ready, respectful and safe. There is additional support for any children who need it and lots of praise to reward appropriate behaviours. In addition to this, we have weekly awards to celebrate successes.

If you have any concerns about anything, please contact class teachers. There are adults on the doors every morning. Class teachers are in classrooms greeting the children and getting them straight onto activities, but messages can always be passed on. Class teachers all see the children onto the playground at the end of the day and can be spoken to at this time, if needed.

Fruit Shop Payment for Spring Term 2024 - Years 3-6

If you would like your child to have fruit and healthy snacks from our Fruit Shop during the Spring Term 2024, would you please make a payment of £14.70 via your ParentPay account by Wednesday, 13 December 2023. This represents a charge of 30p for 1 item every day from our Fruit Shop. Please note that your payment means that your child opts into our Fruit Shop for the full term and, due to the numbers and logistics involved, we are unable to make refunds for absence, etc. If you prefer to pay via a Paypoint, please contact the office to request a Barcode.

Attendance: why is punctuality so important?

It's a GREAT START to the day, putting your child in a positive frame of mind to make the most of the day's learning and activities. Punctuality is linked to good attendance and, as we know, good attenders have more opportunities, more support and therefore achieve more!

We pride ourselves on children having excellent attendance and great punctuality. We believe school really is unmissable so children can engage, build upon prior learning and avoid having gaps in their education. Missing days in school has a detrimental impact on a child's learning and can lead to children not fulfilling their potential. We want all children to



fulfil their potential. Our aim is for all children to have 100% attendance. However, we know that sometimes children cannot come to school because they are really unwell; that's the right thing to do for them and other children. Medical advice is clear, however, that children with mild illness will often be well enough to attend - for example if they have a cough, or cold, without a temperature. Christmas Performances 2023

Our planning for Christmas activities in school is well underway and our Christmas performances are one of the main events and one of the most exciting.

As usual, we would like to invite parents and carers to come and watch the children perform but, due to the size of our school, all our performances will be ticketed. The exception to this is our reception performance where tickets will not be required.

Tickets are free of charge, will be issued on a first-come-first-served basis and will be limited to two tickets per family to allow as many families as possible to attend. (This means that, where a year group has two performances, two tickets IN TOTAL can be requested, i.e. one for each performance or two for the same performance). Children will require a ticket, apart from those aged 2 and under who will be required to sit on an adult's lap. Tickets for children will be part of your family's ticket allocation of 2 tickets.

Ticket booking on ParentPay has been open since Tuesday, 21 November 2023. To help us issue tickets in good time, we ask that you place your orders by Wednesday, 13 December 2023. Where a performance is oversubscribed, we will take into account the date and time the order was placed.
