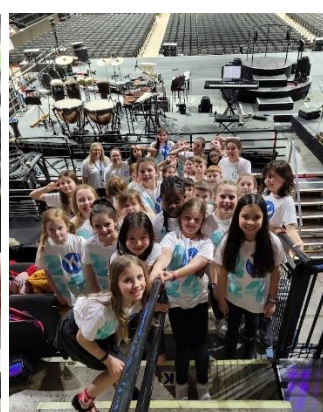

### Year 1 Reading Morning

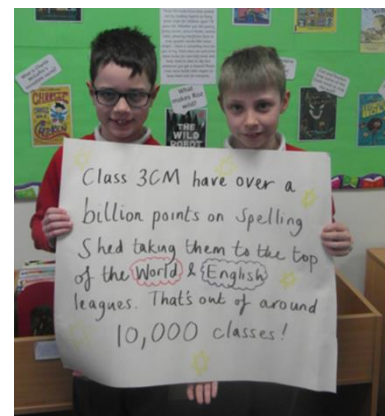

We have a very special award, called Moorlands Marvels, for children who go above and beyond our expectations! This award is very rarely given out as it is saved for very special occasions, where we think WOW!

This week we are delighted to be able to announce that Reggie in 5S has been given the Moorlands Marvel Award. In an RSHE lesson about bullying, Reggie was trying to explain the effects bullying can have. He showed it by using a plain piece of a paper and began scrunching it up to explain that this is what it would look like to have words constantly said or things done. Then Reggie opened it up to show what had happened to the paper and the lasting damage done to it, showing that words and deeds can last a lifetime. The class loved the explanation and could see the effects. Reggie enjoyed a hot chocolate and biscuit with Mrs Denney and Mrs Freeman in recognition.

The whole of 3CM have also been given the Moorlands Marvel Award in recognition of their class contribution to Spelling Shed. Year 3 are extremely proud that 3CM, 3M and 3S are currently sitting in first, second and third ranking for the Moorlands Primary School league. We are delighted to share that the following students are this week's recipients of these awards.









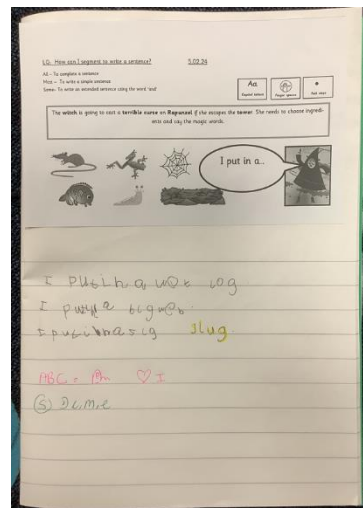


## Moorlands Star Writer of the Week

Dear parents,  
Places are now available to join a new 12-week football course every Tuesday at Moor End Academy, which is open to both boys and girls.

Our courses teach children correct football techniques by FA qualified coaches who have full DBS (CRB) clearance to work with children. The structure for the course is 'FUN through Football,' building confidence for total beginners and moving onto more complex sessions for experienced players.

We provide a ball per player for the majority of our drills ensuring children get more touches of the ball and improve quicker than conventional coaching where children are waiting around to have a turn. The sessions are held in the fantastic sports hall so trainers should be worn. Players are also advised to bring a still drink for the session.

The club has links to local junior teams of which players will be able to play for at the weekend. Players who show advanced ability on the course will be recommended for trials at professional academies. Players who have previously attended courses are currently playing for Bradford City, Sheffield United, Sheffield Wednesday, Manchester United, Liverpool, Leeds United, Everton and Oldham.

The cost of the course is just £5.83 per week, which is payable in two instalments. The first payment of £30 is due when booking your child on and the second payment of £40 due at the first session. Parents are encouraged to watch the sessions but are welcome to leave children, as every session is fully supervised.

### **\*\*NEW TOURNAMENT FORMAT\*\***

Every four weeks we have a tournament in order for the children to put their new-found skills into practice with medals awarded at the end of the course for various categories.

ALL PLAYERS WILL RECEIVE A TROPHY AND MEDAL at the presentation, which is held on the final week of the course. Additional trophies will also be awarded in each group from categories including: Best Attitude, Star Player, Most Improved Player, Most Promising Player and Hardest Working Player.
