Unless you have been given **explicit permission** to enter the school car park, you must not drive onto the school drive at any time.



Skipping continues to be a firm favourite too, with long ropes and group games bringing plenty of energy to playtime.

A huge highlight of the week was the arrival of our new playground speaker, purchased using funds raised by the School Parliament at Christmas. As soon as it was switched on, the playground turned into an instant *disco*—enjoyed equally by children and staff!

Tickets: Tickets are £3 each. They are available to book now on ParentPay. Tickets will be given out, and names will also be on the door to check for children with allergies.

Children with allergies will receive a different coloured ticket and will then be given a wristband to wear during the evening, so helpers can identify children and direct them to appropriate snacks.

Ticket deadline: Tickets must be purchased by **9am on 6th February**. Book early to avoid disappointment! **After this date, it will not be possible for you to buy tickets or to exchange them with someone else.** This is to ensure correct medical/dietary information can be collated in advance of the discos and to enable the PTA to purchase appropriate amounts of refreshments.

Disco Information and Guidelines

We're looking forward to seeing everyone at the upcoming school discos! Here are a few important reminders to ensure the evening runs smoothly:

- **Collection:** All children must be picked up after the discos. They will not be permitted to walk home on their own.
- **Medication:** If your child requires any medication (e.g., inhalers), please ensure it is sent with them to the disco.
- **No Mobile Phones:** Please ensure that your child does not bring a mobile phone.
- **Coats:** When dropping off your child, please take their coat home with you and bring it back at pick-up time. Unfortunately, we don't have enough space to store all coats during the event.
- **Stalls:** There will be stalls offering sweets, crisps, drinks, biscuits, small toys, and keyrings for purchase. Please limit the amount of money sent with your child to £5 and, if possible, send it in smaller denominations or change. Free water will be available throughout the event.




Moorlands Star Writer of the Week
